Dear 6th grade parent,

Congratulations! Your child has been selected to play in **Percussion Class** this year. We are thrilled that he/she will be in our program, and we are looking forward to working with your child for years to come. Please take note of our two concert dates this year: **Monday, December 8th** and **Monday, May 4th**. More information about our concerts will be communicated at a later date.

We took many things into consideration when selecting your child for this instrument. First, we asked each child to select the top three instruments that they would enjoy playing. Then we asked the student to try out on the instruments to see which would suit them the best. Many times, we are able to tell if the child has a chance of success on this instrument by our simple tryout. Also, we looked at instrumentation of our band to make it balanced. For example, a concert band with 35 saxophones and 3 trombones would NOT sound good. In the case of the most competitive instruments, we simply chose the students who had the best tryouts.

First, you do not have to do anything just yet; The purpose of this letter is for you to be able to plan ahead. Just like any major purchase, it is important that you know what to buy. Some percussion brands are excellent for beginners, but some are terrible. Beginning on a poor-quality instrument can cause unwanted habits to develop which are difficult to correct. Additionally, these instruments chronically need repair with parts that are unavailable or are very expensive. In general, you will get what you pay for. We recommend the **Mapex**, **Yamaha** or **Pearl** brand percussion kits. You may rent or buy these instruments at any music store in the area. You should not purchase an instrument from a retail store such as Sam's Club or Costco, as these instruments are low quality and will cause problems in the future. If you choose to look to other areas for an instrument (Ebay, online purchase, etc.) please let us know, and we will be happy to look at the website to make sure that you are getting a good brand at a good deal.

## Palen Music will host an Instrument Rental Night on Monday, August 18th at 7:30 PM at the Jenks High School Performing Arts Center (NW area of JHS campus) to rent/sell percussion instruments.

You may rent or purchase an instrument from them at that time if you choose to do so. Band books and other supplies will also be available. If you cannot make the meeting, you also have the option of renting/buying through <a href="www.palenmusic.com">www.palenmusic.com</a>. If you do this, Palen Music will bring the instrument to the school, and we will deliver it to your child.

We STRONGLY urge you to NOT allow your child to play before they receive our instruction. It is easy to establish poor habits at the onset, and it is very difficult to correct them afterwards.
